## CRITTENTON COMMUNITY GARDEN



Crittenton Centers' mission is to protect and nurture children and families. One of the ways the Center fulfills its mission is through its community garden. The garden provides fresh produce for the Crittenton families and the surrounding community. Salem Lutheran Church helps support the garden by preparing, planting, and harvesting. The garden is divided into two sections. The main garden was planted by Salem member Dean Doughty with assistance from members of Bethel United Methodist, and it contains a variety of vegetables

such as corn, green beans, and potatoes. The raised beds, also known as the children's garden, provide easier accessibility for children and families to participate in the garden experience.

This summer, Salem is partnering with the Crittenton daycare to provide nutrition and plant education for the children. A series of short weekly learning sessions began on May 15 with a lesson about collards followed on May 22 with a lesson about seeds by a guest educator from Luthy Botanical Garden. These lessons have continued to focus on specific vegetables like lettuce, tomatoes, and honey nut squash. Outreach Ministry is grateful to Thrivent Financial for a \$250 Action Team grant that has allowed us to purchase soil and plants for the raised beds, two fruit trees, and folders for the children's educational material.

Come see the bountiful garden at the "Open House" on Wednesday, July 18 from 5pm to 7pm. Everyone is welcome to enjoy a delicious buffet and a tour of the garden by the children. Please sign up at the Welcome Center and indicate if you are willing to bring a salad or dessert to share.







#### **Thomas Jefferson Pen Pals**

A big thank you to the 61 Salem Pen Pals who wrote letters to nearly 80 third graders at Thomas Jefferson School in conjunction with our adopt-a-school partnership. On May 18, Salem Pen Pals gathered at Thomas Jefferson to meet their Pen Pals in the classrooms. The short visit was followed by an entertaining science demonstration presented by Salem's scientist, Kim Ascherl. The science demonstration was enthusiastically received by students and adults alike. At the conclusion, each child received a bag containing a "magic" color cup, a drink and rice Krispy bar.

The Pen Pal Program began 20 years ago and gives students an opportunity to work on writing skills. The children enjoy receiving letters from the Salem Pen Pals in return. Thanks again for your participation in this great program and making it a continued success!







## Malawi Yarn Project

As the heat of the summer wraps in all around us, we may find it difficult to imagine the first cool days of fall. Those days where the sun is shining, but when you step out, you feel a cool breeze on your bare arms. As you dash back inside the house to grab a sweatshirt or sweater, you put it on without giving it a second thought. Now imagine if you had no sweater to pull out of the drawer for yourself or to pull off the coat rack for your child. Imagine you could not afford to buy your child a sweater, or if they were orphaned and their care facility did not have the means for such clothing. Imagine if it was a requirement for your child to have a sweater in order to attend school, but because you could not afford a sweater, they weren't allowed to attend. In Malawi this is a harsh reality for many parents and children.

Recently, however, God's work is being done through the generous hands of people. Through the skill of one individual in Malawi who knows how to knit and a group of individuals willing to learn, sweaters for school uniforms have begun to be made for children at a local orphanage. However, due to the high cost of yarn and needles, the knitting group is facing a challenge to make as many sweaters as are needed. The Ulrich family, working in Malawi, brought this project to our attention and extended the call to our congregation for support. A request was made of Salem for yarn and knitting needles to address this need.

Through your generosity, Salem has answered the call! On Sunday, April 29th, we kicked off our collection campaign with a temple talk by Bill Ligon explaining the project and sharing photos of Malawi and the individuals working there. The yarn project collection wrapped up on Sunday, May 20th, and we are pleased to announce that we collected enough yarn to fill an extra-large moving box and \$550 to help purchase more yarn and offset shipping costs. Well done Salem! We thank everyone who contributed to this project. The Outreach Ministry Team is especially grateful to Sue McGrew, Sharon Mollenhauer, and Mary Ann Welch for leading and organizing this collection. Their expertise was invaluable, and it will be their hands that help take what you all have contributed and send the packages off to Malawi. How blessed to be part of a church that takes seriously the mission to "love and serve"

#### Fourth of July Safety

Fourth of July celebrations can be fun times with great memories but make sure everyone knows about fireworks safety. If not handled properly, fireworks can cause burns and eye injuries in kids and adults. The best way to protect everyone is not to use any fireworks at home and attend public fireworks displays. If fireworks are legal where you live and you choose to use fireworks at home, keep these safety tips in mind:

- Only purchase legal fireworks from a reputable dealer. Read and carefully follow the instructions listed on the safety label. Never try to make your own fireworks.
- Remember to never let young children touch or light fireworks. If you give kids sparklers, make sure they keep them outside and away from the face, clothing, and hair. Sparklers can reach 1,800°F. Glowsticks are an alternative.
- Never point a firework at another person, carry a firework in your pocket or wear loose clothing around fireworks. Point fireworks away from homes, and keep away from brush and leaves and flammable substances.
- Keep a bucket of water or hose handy for both emergencies and for disposing of fireworks.
- Steer clear of others setting off fireworks. They can backfire or shoot off in the wrong direction.
- Light one firework at a time and never relight a dud.
- Don't allow kids to pick up pieces of fireworks after an event. Some may still be ignited and can explode at any time.



#### What is Leadership Lab?

Leadership Lab is a week-long, fun and faith filled, intense, handson leadership experience for young people held on the campus of Augustana College each summer. It is a combined ministry of the three Illinois Synods of the ELCA, (Central/Southern Illinois, Metro-Chicago/Northern Illinois).
