Second, I invite you to attend the Dream Leader Initiative on Saturday, June 2, from 8:30-2:30. Pastor Jeff Linman will be leading us in a time of dreaming about Salem's future and who God calls us to be. Yes, it is most of a Saturday, and yes, it is a Saturday in summer. But Salem's leadership felt that this was too great an opportunity to miss offering this retreat. We will spend time together considering where God is leading us and what the obstacles are. Please give serious consideration to attending that day; your voice matters, because God is working in you as much as God is working in me or another Salem disciple.

Please join me and other Salem leaders in dreaming and planning for the future that God has in mind for Salem! We all hope that Salem will be here for future generations, so let's be intentional together about our next steps!

Congregational Meeting Sunday, June 10

Historic Bishop Elections

Electing a synod bishop is always an interesting and moving moment for synods. This year it has been historic. On May 5, the Southeastern Pennsylvania Synod of the ELCA elected the Rev. Patricia A. Davenport to be bishop. She is the first African-descent woman bishop to be elected. The very next day, 900 miles away, the Rev. Viviane Thomas-Breitfeld became the second when the South-Central Synod of Wisconsin elected her as their new bishop. The DreamLeaders Initiative is Coming to Salem Lutheran Church June 1-June 3!

Salem Lutheran Church will be hosting a DreamLeaders Initiative weekend, June 1- June 3, designed to encourage, inspire, and challenge us to pursue God sized dreams for our future that will allow us to have greater Kingdom impact in our neighborhood and city. The Initiative is designed to promote renewal in today's church and will be led by Pastor Jeff Linman, Pastor of Renewal and Redevelopment at First Lutheran Church in Monmouth, Illinois. Pastor Jeff previously served for 20 years as the founding pastor of Spirit of Joy Lutheran Church in Orlando, Florida where the Initiative was birthed.

The weekend contains three components:

- A Friday Evening Get Acquainted Fellowship Meal from 6pm to 8pm in the social hall to give church council and staff a big picture overview of the DreamLeaders Initiative as well as giving the Initiative coordinator, Pastor Jeff Linman, a chance to get to know leaders and staff and get a feel for our congregation and community. We hope to wrap up the evening with momentum and a positive spirit for the weekend.
- A Saturday Workshop from 8:30am to 2:30pm in the social hall for congregational leaders and all Salem Lutheran Church disciples interested in dreaming together about our future. The day will include Biblically based elements of encouragement (naming our fears), inspiration (dreaming some dreams), and challenge (identifying the obstacles). Each workshop section will be tailored to our congregation's unique context and season. Lunch will be provided.
- A Sunday Worship Experience called "Created to Dream" and Forum that will engage the entire congregation in the journey and bring everyone on-board. Pastor Jeff will preach and share a children's message at our Sunday worship service at the 9am. After worship he will lead a brief Q&A Session where the results of the Saturday workshop will be shared and feedback invited from those who participated so that the entire congregation can be invited into the journey and the Initiative's impact extended. When leaders and members are aligned in pursuit of God-sized visions and dreams God's power is released so that every congregation can realize Kingdom impact through their mission and ministry!

Ephesians 3:20 teaches us that by the power at work within us, God is able to accomplish abundantly far more than all we can ask or imagine... or dream! Because attitude impacts outcome, inspiring renewed faith and hope is a key step in any congregational renewal effort seeking increased Kingdom impact. Fair Trade: OUTREACH Potang Tea Garden

Fair Trade Sunday for June will be June 10, 2018! Stop by and pick up some items for summer or Father's Day.

Tea, whether you drink it hot or iced, has been a popular item at Salem. Your Fair Trade tea is sourced from cooperatives in India, Sri Lanka and South Africa. Here is a story about one of the newer tea producers in India:

In the foothills of the Himalayas, the Potong Tea Garden, once a colonial plantation, now collectively run by its workers, is making history. It is generating significant improvements for the garden's 350 workers and their families and helping to spark a badly needed transformation of the tea industry. The Potong Tea Garden is addressing a difficult challenge: how to build a new tea system out of a decaying and crumbling plantation model that remains largely unchanged from the days of the British Empire. Approximately 50 million workers throughout the developing world make their livelihoods from this industry.

Due to the feudal nature of tea plantations, workers are often trapped in a system of dependency. If a worker loses

his/her job, or if the plantation is abandoned, thousands of workers and their families are left without any form of income, housing, or services.

In 2005, the owners of Potong approached Tea Promoters of India (TPI), one of the tea industry's most progressive and visionary companies, asking them to consider running the estate. Committed to making small farmer ownership possible, representatives of TPI proposed a solution to keep the estate in operation. Today, the workers are learning to own, manage, and operate their tea garden. With training and technical assistance from TPI, they are learning new skills, taking risks, and rebuilding operations.

These are some of the people supported by Salem's Fair Trade Sundays. Be sure to buy some tea or any of our other coffee, chocolate, or fair foods products in the Gallery after services on Sunday, June 10.
