As a result of the 146 to 2 vote in support of his Call, Pastor Craig on July 8, Salem Lutheran Church voted to call Pastor Craig Swenson as our next Senior Pastor. Pastor Craig comes to us from Wausau, Wisconsin where he had been serving as Senior Pastor. Pastor Craig has been at Saint Andrew for the last nine years. Pastor Craig was born and raised on a farm in western lowa. He received a BS in Behavioral Science, 1991, from Midland Lutheran College, Fremont, NE and a Master of Divinity, 1995, from Wartburg Theological Seminary, Dubuque, IA. Previous to his service at Saint Andrew, Pastor Craig served a two-point parish at Immanuel Lutheran Church in Minok, IL and Bethany Lutheran in Wenona, IL for 14 years.

Pastor Craig, and his wife Karen, have two married sons, one in Tennessee and one in Washington, IL, as well as three young grandchildren in Washington.

Pastor's strengths include preaching and teaching, pastoral care and visitation, evangelism and mission, and building a sense of community. Pastor Craig is an avid cycler, enjoys landscaping and singing. We welcome Pastor Craig and Karen into the Salem family. Pastor Craig's first day at Salem will be August 13.

Backpacks for Back to School! Backpacks come in all sizes and designs. They let children of all ages express their own style and when utilized properly, they're helpful. Compared with shoulder bags, messenger bags, or purses, backpacks are better because strong muscles. The back and

the abdominal muscles support the weight of the packs. When worn correctly, the weight in a backpack is evenly distributed across the body, and shoulder and neck injuries are less common. As practical as backpacks are, they can strain muscles and joints and may cause back pain if they're too heavy or are used incorrectly. Here's how to help your children find and use the right backpack. Look for:

- A lightweight pack: get one that doesn't add a lot of weight to your child's load. Also, pack light. The backpack should never weigh more than 10 to 20 percent of the student's total body weight.
- The correct size: never wider or longer than your child's torso and never hanging more than 4 inches below the waist.
- Two wide, padded shoulder straps: straps that are too narrow can dig into shoulders and slinging a backpack over one shoulder cannot distribute weight evenly and can strain muscles. Wearing a backpack on one shoulder may also increase curvature of the spine.
- A padded back: it not only provides increased comfort, but also protects kids from being poked by sharp objects inside the pack.
- A waist belt: this helps to distribute the weight more evenly across the body
- Multiple compartments: to help distribute the weight throughout the pack
- You may need to adjust your child's backpack and/or reduce how much they carry if they:
 - Struggle to get the backpack on or off
 - Have back pain
 - Lean forward to carry the backpack

If after adjusting, your child has back pain or numbness or weakness in the arms or legs, talk to your doctor.

2018 Central/Southern Illinois Synod Assembly

This year, the Synod Assembly was held in Champaian, Illinois on June 7-9. Over 260 voting members from across the synod attended the assembly this year. The theme of the assembly was "Remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age." (Matthew 28:20) In addition to conducting the "business of the Synod", the assembly included time for devotions, bible studies, special topic forums, worship, a hymn sing, and even an ice cream social.

Bishop John Roth mentioned he will be on sabbatical from October 7 through January 6. Synod staff changes were recognized. including Pastor Elise being called as Director of Evangelical Mission (DEM). Elections for Synod Council, Consultation Committee, and delegates for the 2019 Churchwide Assembly were held, and Pastor Paul Park was elected to the Consultation Committee. The Synod Assembly also included numerous reports from the Synod Council Treasurer, LSSI, Portico, Lutheran Campus Ministry, Lutheran Outdoor Ministry Center (LOMC), and various Auxiliaries such as Lutheran Youth Organization and Women of the ELCA. Next year's Synod Assembly will be held in Springfield.

ELCA Youth Gathering in Houston

Every three years, 30,000 high school youth and their adult leaders from across the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America gather for a week of faith formation known as the ELCA Youth Gathering. Through days spent in interactive learning, worship, Bible study, service and fellowship, young people grow in faith and are challenged and inspired to live their faith in their daily lives. Salem was represented by 16 high school students and 7 adult leaders at the 2018 ELCA Youth Gathering in Houston.

Our entire experience was just fabulous! I usually have two simple goals for our students when they participate in experiences like the Gathering:

- 1. That they grow in love for each other and for Christ, and
- 2. That what they hear, discover and experience challenges them to live their faith more fully throughout their lives.



The experience of traveling 15 hours together each way on our AWESOME church bus, rooming together for almost a week, sharing meals, exploring Houston, and having fun together pretty much guarantees students and adults will grow closer with each other. Worshipping with 30,000 new friends each night increases our love for Christ and our confidence in expressing it. And, the theme and speakers chosen for this year's Gathering absolutely made us think about faith intersecting daily life.

The Gathering Theme: "This Changes Everything" was divided into five daily themes: God's Call Changes Everything, God's Hope Changes Everything; God's Love Changes Everything; God's Grace Changes Everything and finally: Jesus Changes Everything! Each day our Bible stories, speaker presentations, service work, and interactions focused on these daily themes. For our service day, we painted a house and tore old wooden siding off of it. You all would've been so proud of the way our group pulled together to make a difference for that homeowner!

I am so very thankful for the adult leaders that went along on this trip. Their enthusiasm, energy and love for our kids was incredible. To the youth group parents...thank you for allowing your kids to go and experience something as huge as over 30,000 youth getting together to worship our loving God! To those of you who supported us in preparation for this trip, whether it be financially or with prayer, I thank you from the bottom of my heart!

Salem's adopt-a-school partnership with Thomas Jefferson Primary School is beginning another year. Our congregation has been supporting Thomas Jefferson for about 20 years in various ways. In addition to the programs listed below we give a monetary gift each year, provide food baskets at Christmas.

> Last year the Classroom Volunteer program was reorganized to combine tutoring and helping with skill development. Those who have worked in program last year will be contacted

to see about continuing, but we are seeking additional volunteers for the Classroom Volunteer program. At this time teachers have not yet signed up for this year, but they will probably do that the first week of school. Last year, 14 teachers requested a volunteer, and we had a volunteer in each of those classes.

In the past most volunteers have committed to a weekly schedule, but teachers understand that there will be times during the years when

> a volunteer cannot be at school. Once a volunteer is paired with a teacher, the volunteer will be given the teacher's contact information. The volunteer will let the teacher know the amount of time that he/she can commit to each week. The two will then work out their own schedule for day/time.
