Salem Members Approve Motions to Proceed



On Sunday, February 10, two motions

were approved at the Special Congregational Meeting. 1. Enter into a contract with Miller Architects & Builders (MA&B) to draft construction drawings for the building project and to proceed with project bids. 2. Proceed with installing a new digital on the street side of the building. Funds are available for both of these decisions.

Installation of the sign will take place when weather permits.

The Salem Building Design Team will now meet regularly with Dave TeBrake from (MA&B) to formalize the construction drawings. This process will take several months including receiving bids and vetting potential contractors.

Once the bids are received there will be scopes of work to vote on. An August timeframe is expected for this congregational vote. To date, the Capital Appeal contributions received are \$565,584.65, and pledges in support of this appeal are \$1,982,020.24. Your support and generosity are blessings as together we work to make this concept a reality. Thank you for continued support and generosity to ensure that worship blesses those who gather and that learning and growth happens for people of all ages. Reaching out in compassion and service to others is a tangible expression of God's love to our neighbors. Thank you for your support toward this effort!

April 7 - Snack foods – crackers, granola bars, fruit cups, cookies, etc.


April 14 – Cereal, oatmeal, etc.

Serving Our Neighbors at the Crittenton Centers

Crittenton Centers has been serving Peoria and all of central Illinois since 1892. Currently, their three core services include the Crisis Nursery (emergency and respite care for infants and children ages birth to 6 years), the Child Development Center (preschool and daycare for infants and children ages 6 weeks to 6 years) and Educational and Support Services. Crittenton Centers' mission is to protect and nurture children and families.

Elaine Sokolowski is a Salem member who volunteers at Crittenton Crisis Nursery. She shares with us a bit about how she became involved at Crittenton Centers.



"I am really not certain when I became aware of Crittenton, but I always have been interested in young children. When my own children were young, I was a preschool teacher, and I always promised myself that, when I retired from library work, I would volunteer at the nursery. I would encourage anyone who enjoys children to volunteer there. Plentiful hugs are supplied!"

More About the Crittenton Crisis Nursery

The Crisis Nursery is always open to anyone, regardless of their financial need or circumstance. The Crittenton Crisis Nursery provides child abuse prevention services for children from birth to six years; through emergency intervention and respite care, crisis counseling, and support services to families facing stress related to domestic violence, parenting challenges, mental health issues, and other situations that put children at risk. In turn, parent stress levels are reduced, parenting skills increased, and children are safe.

Elaine volunteers once a week at the nursery which involves playing and reading to the children, feeding or rocking a baby, and more. If there is a child in need, the child is sent home with new clothes, coats, etc. Parents may also receive free diapers, wipes, and formula once a month. These items given to parents depends on donations.

What can you do to help?

Crittenton Centers gladly accepts diapers, formula, clothes, educational toys, and other infant & child related items, or you may make a monetary donation. You can make a difference! Other Opportunities to Serve at Crittenton Centers

Quite a few Salem members give their time to the Crittenton Centers. The Doughtys and Ligons spearhead the Crittenton Garden in the summer months. Through the garden initiative, the children learn about growing healthy food and any family can pick what they want.


Affirmation of Baptism
