What are the dark moments of your life that beckon for light so that we do not feel frightened or alone or without hope? But what about those times when even Google or Siri seems

I suggest that the inspired and written word leads us into relationship with the word that became flesh and brings us real hope and light in the darkness. These words offer us a future hope that resonate in human hearts and are lived out in human relationships.

As we continue to transition from one day to the next, it is my prayer that we seek answers to our deepest questions where God promises to be. Cross and cradle. Death and life. Seen and unseen. God has come and will come among us again and again. Look no further than the one born among us to lead us to hope

and limitless possibilities to share in God's abundance. May Jesus Christ be born in us again this season!

I look forward to seeing you in worship as we celebrate this good news together.

If you are planning a gift to offset 2019 income, you'll want to be aware of the official rules from the IRS: "Donors must deliver or mail checks on or by December 31, 2019, in order to claim a charitable contribution deduction for 2019. Checks that are placed in the church offering on the first Sunday of 2020 will not qualify for a charitable contribution deduction in 2019, even if the check is pre-dated to 2019 or was actually written in 2019. However, checks that are written, mailed and post-marked in 2019 will be deductible in 2019 though they are not received by a church until 2020."

Thank you for keeping these things in mind as you plan your giving, and blessings and peace on your New Year ahead!
