Constitution Amendment

The Salem Congregation Council voted at their December 3 meeting to recommend a change to Section C12.01 of the Constitution for Salem Evangelical Lutheran Church.

The current constitution states "The voting membership of the Congregation Council shall consist of the pastor(s) and not more than 16 nor fewer than 14 members of the congregation.

The proposed motion from the Council is to recommend the following :

"The voting membership of the Congregation Council shall consist of the rostered leaders and not more than 12 nor fewer than 9 members of the congregation."

This recommendation will be on the agenda of the next Annual Meeting which will be **January 26, 2020 at 12:30pm**. If approved, it will need to be ratified at the 2021 Annual Meeting before becoming effective.

Though we don't want to think about it, the time of year where slips and falls occur due to winter precipitation is here. Even when ice and snow are cleared, there may be icy patches that remain. Do your best at preventing falling by:

- Wearing proper foot gear.
- Take small steps to keep your center of balance under you.
- Walk slowly and never run on icy ground.
- Keep both hands free for balance, rather than in your pockets.
- Use handrails from start to finish.
- Avoid carrying loads on stairways; carry loads that you can see over.
- Keep your eyes on where you are going.
- Test potentially slick areas by tapping your foot on them.
- Step slowly from vehicles.
- Keep walkways clear of debris, water, ice and slippery materials.
