A GIVING PROGRESS UPDATE

Since August 1, Renewing God's House capital appeal cash receipts have exceeded \$150,000. To date over \$1,800,000 in total cash contributed and other gifts have been received towards this three-year appeal. ### JUNIOR HIGH - FAITH FOR LIFE

**FAITH FOR LIFE** students (6th, 7th & 8th graders) are experiencing **FAITH AT HOME** from now through the end of 2020. All students have received a pack of **30 LIVE YOUR FAITH** activities and are required to complete 15 of their choice (approximately 1 per week) by the end of 2020. They will be reviewing these activities with their parents each week. Watch for examples of these activities in future newsletters this fall.

In addition to these activities, **FAITH FOR LIFE** students are participating in Sunday night devotions on ZOOM. These devotions are 20 minutes long in an effort to limit student screen time. We are following the same Old Testament Bible Stories the Sunday School program is using and adding a quick **FAITH FOR TODAY** discussion, sharing highs and lows, and sending students off with a prayer and blessing on their week ahead. In September, these devotions were shared with Kappa Chi and the students were separated by genders. **Starting Sunday. October 4, Faith for Life students will have devotions together at 7pm and high school students will meet on-line at 7:30pm.** 



(year to date) because churches are closed during the pandemic. This in turn affects the small farmers, as there is less demand for their products.



First, I would like to thank my Salem family for all their support not only following my mother, Arlene Schroeder's death but throughout her long illness of Alzheimer's. Thank you for your constant prayers, words of support, meaningful cards, and contributions to Salem's Endowment

and other designated memorials. Caregiving as well as the grieving process is never easy but the load is definitely lightened when supported by loved ones and friends.

Grief has many facets and is different for each of us. As one who has experienced the loss of many loved ones both sudden and "expected," the journey is not only different from one person to another but even within ourselves each time it happens. There is no right or wrong way to mourn with a set timetable of specific rules. Rather grief is a process with no particular beginning or end.

I like this excerpt from the Women of the ELCA's study, "The Faces of Grief" — "There appear to be seasons of grief, each with different colors and each with a different purpose. In the fall of grief, we let go just as leaves let go of the trees and fall to the ground. The winter of grief is the time of going inside, the inner journey, a time of hibernation as it were. In the springtime of grief new life begins to emerge; and summer is the time when life continues, and we let it be nourished and grow. Again, we need to remember that the process is seldom linear. We may move from spring back into winter for a while, and the letting go process often is ongoing."

Grief is commonly thought about following the death of a loved one but one often grieves following the loss of a job, one's good health, a relationship, a home, pet, financial stability, and more. The grieving process affects us emotionally, mentally, physically, and spiritually. There are many things we can do to take care of ourselves as we work through those seasons of grief but that would be another article. For more resources regarding grief, you can contact me and when we are able to get back together again, stop by the Parish Nurse office to look at resources.
