SALEM FAMILY -LET'S SOCK IT TO **THEM IN JANUARY!**

Socks are the most sought-after clothing item by homeless people and are in extremely high demand at homeless shelters, especially in the winter. Salem's Outreach Ministry and the Children, Youth and Family Program are teaming up to collect SOCKS throughout the month of

January. The socks will be donated to various local ministries who serve Peoria's shelters and homeless population.

Please consider picking up an extra pair of socks (or pack of socks) on your next shopping trip or ordering socks on-line. You can call the church to drop them off any weekday from 8:30am-Noon in January or you can leave new socks in the large blue weatherproof container at the back entrance to church at any time during the month.

If you want to get more bang for your SOCKS, order your socks at www.bombas.com. For every pair of socks you purchase, Bombas donates a pair to programs serving the homeless through their Make A Purchase, Make A Difference Campaign. They've donated more than 40 million pairs of socks to more than 2500 community organizations to date. (And, they have great socks!)

Thanks in advance for your donations! Together we will bring hope, healing and warm, dry feet to everyone facing homelessness in our community. Please feel free to encourage your friends and family to share this collection opportunity! There will be a collection bin located under the balcony for donation drop off.

January is National Blood Donor Awareness Month. According to the American Red Cross, winter is "one of the most difficult times of year to collect enough blood products to meet patient needs." This can be due to busy holiday schedules and bad weather often resulting in canceled blood drives or donations. In addition to our current Covid pandemic, seasonal illnesses such as the flu force potential donors to forgo their blood donations. These are a few of the reasons that National Blood Donor Month has taken place each January since 1970. Don't wait for a disaster, give blood every 56 days (112 for double reds). While 38% of the U.S. population is eligible to donate, less than

10% go out and do it. About 36,000 units of red blood cells and 7,000 units of platelets are needed every single day in the U.S. The most requested blood type by hospitals is type O as it can be transfused to patients of all blood types and only 7% of people in the U.S. have type O. Blood is the most precious gift that anyone can give to another person — the gift of life.

It will be located again at Northwoods mall (area to be determined). You are eligible to give if you have not donated since November 23, 2020. Go to
