



t is a rainy Monday morning. sunshine. No temperature like recent days. It is a rather gloomy day as trees, farm fields, landscape areas and gardens remain lifeless after the winter thaw. For those who suffer from Seasonal Affective Disorder. days like this are difficult. And yet, I hear birds singing as if to announce the arrival of spring and the hope that is unfolding as daffodils, tulips, crocus plants blossom to welcome a new season of life again. Spring is coming and soon color will return to the barren landscape. We learn to expect this renewing process and I suspect even yearn for this change all the more this spring. Just one year ago, we were entering a lockdown mandate that redefined how we live and interact with people and the world around us. I recall being nervous about visiting across the yard with our next-door neighbors as we did our part to shelter in place, work from home, limit interpersonal contacts. Much has changed in these many months and yet some things are quite the same. This spring feels different, however, with less anxiety and more hope that we are slowly beginning to return to life that feels more "normal" than it did just months ago.

Even though vaccinations are taking place, I am hopeful we are more attentive to the need to do what we can to care for our neighbors and help reduce the spread of persistent

and dangerous virus. Such a small thing, yet having the ability of effecting dramatic consequences. While we would like to be able to fully gather again, sing, share a table for coffee and conversation face-to-face, give hugs, remove masks, we are not there yet. I have been wearing several cloth masks interchangeably for these many months and decided I should consider getting new ones. As I considered what to get, I realized they are cheaper in larger quantities but will I really need 25 masks? If I wear a new one each week, that gets us into mid-September! That thought was initially as gloomy as today's weather. But then I realized that being intentional with my precautions not only helps me but also those around me.

Spring is coming and even though we may wish for it to come more quickly, we would do well to wait for it with patience and hopeful anticipation so that we can experience the excitement of its unfolding again. Time beyond this pandemic is coming and yet we would do well to practice patience and love with hopeful anticipation to a time we can gather and live freely again.

The journey of Lent is coming to a close. Soon we enter the holy days of Maundy Thursday and Good Friday so that we can more fully embrace the Easter proclamation again and where on our lips or in our hearts, we can rejoice knowing that Christ is risen! He is risen indeed! Alleluia! Jesus has come and promises to come again. Rejoice! Rejoice! This is good news!

Looking ahead: As we consider the growing season before us, I will be offering a prayer of blessing for the soil and the seed as part of worship May 2. Anticipate the May Bugle article for more details.

#### **Salem Endowment Fund News**



### FROM THE PARISH NURSE LORI REIMER, RN

#### **Laughter is Contagious...**

"Did you hear the one about...?" Who doesn't like a good joke, anecdotal story, or a funny movie? The sound of laughter can be contagious (in this case that word is good). Nothing works faster to bring our minds and bodies back into balance than a good, hearty laugh!

Why does laughter make us feel so good... physically and mentally?

- Stimulates your organs: When you laugh, you take in more oxygen-rich air. This stimulates your lungs, heart, and muscles.
- Relaxes your muscles: A good laugh can relieve physical tension in the body and relax the muscles for up to 45 minutes
- Improves cardiac health: Laughing increases your heart rate and the amount of oxygen in your blood which sends more oxygen to your tissues.
- Boosts immune system as well as a positive mood: Laughter increases endorphins and immune cells (the ones our body needs to fight off infection) as well as decreases stress hormones. This can also help lower your blood pressure.
- Helps with weight loss: Laughing not only reduces the stress hormones that cause weight gain, but it also burns calories.
- Provides distraction: Laughter provides your brain with a break from the worrying thoughts that cause stress.
- Improves your mood: Laughing produces a general sense of well-being and can diffuse the anger and depression you were once feeling.
- Strengthens relationships: A shared laugh with friends, family or a coworker can help you feel more connected to that person and form a strong and lasting bond. Humor is also a powerful way to heal past disagreements or resentments

ONE light-weight bath-size towel (between 20" x 40" and 52" x 27"), dark color recommended
TWO or three bath-size bars of soap equaling 8 to 9 oz., any brand, in original wrapping
ONE adult-size toothbrush in its original packaging
ONE sturdy comb
ONE metal nail clipper

#### **IMPORTANT GUIDELINES TO REMEMBER**

- Items must be new
- Towel should be light-weight allowing kit recipients to easily hand wash and air dry.
- Please do not donate items with any religious symbols, messages or your group's name.
- Please do not donate any items decorated with a U.S. flag, patriotic or military symbols, or references to the armed forces, including camouflage.
