As this year unfolds, we long for signs of hope and new life, at the same time, we experience the ongoing challenge or living in the shadow of a pandemic, social and political unrest, economic hardships for many, and the ongoing interpretation and adaptation of climate science. Depending how each of these issues affect us personally, it can play a significant role in shaping our perspective and ultimately our choices and beliefs.

While our plans for Lent last year were made prior to the pandemic, much of our forty-day journey was spent distanced and connected only virtually. This year, we will again be virtual, but we will plan for it rather than adapt to it. Ash Wednesday begins our journey on February 17. Due to the challenges,

we will not impose ashes and commune together. There will be a virtual service shared instead. As it seems to relate well to our current time in life, the theme for this year's journey will be Hope through the Wilderness. There are many wilderness examples in scripture. Together but in a virtual way, we will ponder many of these stories to see how the biblical witness gives us reason to live with hope, even in challenging and uncertain times. St. Paul describes hope this way, "suffering produces, endurance, endurance produces character and character produces hope and hope does not disappoint us. For God's love has been poured out for us through the Holy Spirit." Romans 5:3-5

The ways the world can disappoint us and weaken our perception of hope. But real hope does not come from within, it is a gift of God, poured out for us. Please join me on this journey as together we identify ways God is revealed to renew our hope in God's abundant love through Jesus. May God bless our wilderness journey with hope, abundant hope.



February is National Heart Month with Wear Red Day being February 5

The best prevention from cardiovascular disease is good nutrition, proper exercise, and knowing your risk factors. There are some risk factors that you cannot control: your age, gender, family health history, race, or the fact that you had a previous stroke or heart attack. Knowing these factors that may predispose you to heart disease (as well as strokes) should also make you look even harder at the risk factors we can all control. These factors include high blood pressure, smoking, high blood cholesterol, lack of regular activity, obesity, and diabetes. Heart attack symptoms can differ for men and women, but the most common symptom for both is chest pain. Men's symptoms include squeezing chest pressure or pain as well as jaw, neck or back pain, nausea or vomiting, and shortness of breath. Women may have non-chest pain symptoms and less obvious warning signs. Symptoms in women include chest pain (but not always); a pain or pressure in the lower chest or upper abdomen; jaw, neck, or upper back pain; nausea or vomiting; shortness of breath; fainting; indigestion; and extreme fatigue. Know these signs can help save yours or a loved one's life. Even if you are not sure it's a heart attack, have it checked out. Minutes do matter. Call 911 if you experience heart attack warning signs. This is almost always the fastest way to get lifesaving treatment. Do not drive yourself! An emergency medical services (EMS) team can begin treatment when they arrive – up to an hour sooner than if someone gets to the hospital by car. 

 - I can't thank you enough for your recent donation of \$1,000.00 donation that you made on December 29, 2020 to Neighborhood House. As we navigate through COVID-19 and sheltering in place, we have refocused all of our programs towards feeding people.
 - Since March 15th, we have added 583 seniors to our Meals on Wheels program. This number increases daily. This meant the addition of 5 new staff to create new routes.
 - As more seniors join our program, more pets are in need of food through our Critters Meals on Wheels program. We are currently feeding 127 pets on the program.
 - · We started delivering hot meals and snack packs for the 60 kids in our youth program, Monday through Friday. We are now serving 220 per day and counting.
 - Many food pantries have closed, so we increased our pantry to be open weekly instead of bi-weekly to meet the growing need.
