

PASTOR CRAIG SWENSON ENTRUSTED WITH GIFTS

n his Synod Assembly sermon, Bishop John reminded us of God's promise and our calling: "What an amazing gift this is, that God willingly puts so much trust in us. God, who knows us better than we know ourselves, who sees through all the masks we wear - and I'm not talking COVID masks - still, trusts us to speak, to live, to embody the boundless, reconciling grace of God in our Lord Jesus Christ – because this reconciling grace makes us who we are. No pandemic can change that. No politics can take it away. No pressure can crush it. This is God's promise to you – and it is God's promise to us as the Central/Southern Illinois Synod of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America you are entrusted."

You are entrusted, with gifts, without strings without earning them or owning them. Gifts are entrusted to us as freely given and freely received. With that comes responsibility, joy and freedom. Responsibility in that gifts are not intended to be static, sit on a shelf to be admired, uninspiring, unuseable. No, gifts are intended to be shared, applied, to make a difference, to shine in the open rather than hidden and hoarded. We are caretakers, stewards, servants and God is the one who provides, freely and abundantly. What we do with what is entrusted to us is fruit of the faith that claims God's blessings.

We have recently shifted to Paul's letter to the Ephesians as the New Testament reading in worship. On August 1, the reading is Ephesians 4:1-16 where Paul defines a variety of gifts for the purpose of building up the body of Christ. Again, the purpose of the gifts is not self-promoting, self-preservation or selffulfillment. It is for the purpose of growing others in Christ. We are encouragers, leaders, witnesses of the good news of Jesus coming among us in our brokenness, even when we do not especially feel the need for news that is better than what we are experiencing. (If that is ever possible!) In the baptismal liturgy, parents are told that they are entrusted with responsibilities: to live among God's faithful people, bring their child to the services of God's house, teach them the Lord's Prayer, Creed and Commandments, place in their hands the holy scriptures, nurture them in

faith and prayer so that the child may learn to trust God (may come to faith), care for the world God has

made and to strive for justice and peace in all the earth. It is a large task and in truth, it is something to which we are all held accountable, to care for the other and even to *desire* to care for the other in our midst. What gifts has God entrusted to you? How do you share in what God provides and the opportunities that help build up the church? The life we share is a blessing, a gift, an opportunity to tell others about God's abundant goodness which has come among us in the person of Jesus. Join me in sharing this joy with others.

ESTATE GIFTS

Recently, Salem received two estate gifts from former members, David Schwab and John Johnson. Both David and John were longtime members and loved their church. Salem was blessed by their generosity while they were actively involved but now also as legacy gifts that will further extend their generosity.

The Schwab gift of \$592,475.00 has been designated to help pay down the mortgage (\$392,475 to principle) and the remaining \$200,000 will be used to grow the Endowment Fund and further share generosity with others. It will first be loaned to Salem to further pay down the mortgage principle. This portion will be repaid to the Endowment Fund after the mortgage is fully satisfied at an annual rate of 2%. That \$4,000 interest will be an annual benevolent opportunity for the Endowment Committee to share in addition to any income accumulated by the invested funds. The Johnson gift of \$28,546.01 will be used to help offset the cost of new chiller units (sanctuary AC system) that will be updated later this summer.

Thanks to David and John for remembering their church with planned giving. Thanks to Salem leaders for creatively applying the gifts. And thanks to God for the opportunity to advance and enhance the work of Christ's church through generous giving. What blessings!

AUGUST BOOK: The Women of the Bible Speak

People unfamiliar with scripture often assume that women play a small, secondary role in the Bible. But in fact, they were central figures in numerous Biblical tales. It was Queen Esther's bravery at a vital point in history which saved her entire people. The Bible contains warriors like Jael, judges like Deborah, and prophets like Miriam. The first person to witness Jesus' resurrection was Mary Magdalene, who promptly became the first Christian evangelist, eager to share the news which would change the world forever.

In *The Women of the Bible Speak*, Fox News Channel's Shannon Bream opens up the lives of sixteen of these Biblical women, arranging them into pairs and contrasting their journeys. In pairing their stories, Shannon helps us reflect not only on the meaning of each individual's life, but on how they relate to each other and to us.

From the shepherdesses of ancient Israel who helped raise the future leaders of the people of God, to the courageous early Christians, the narrative of the Bible offers us many vivid and fascinating female characters. In their lives we can see common struggles to resist bitterness, despair, and pride, and to instead find their true selves in faith, hope, and love. In studying these heroes of the faith, we can find wisdom and warnings for how to better navigate our own faith journeys.

The Women of the Bible Speak outlines the lessons we can take from the valor of Esther, the hope of Hannah, the audacity of Rahab, and the faith of Mary. In broadening each woman's individual story, Shannon offers us a deeper understanding of each, and wisdom and insights that can transform our own lives today.

FROM THE PARISH NURSE, LORI REIMER, RN SAFEGUARD YOUR EYESIGHT

Safeguarding your eyesight is an essential part of your overall health. Some steps to think about include:

- Know your family history so you and your ophthalmologist can watch for conditions like glaucoma or macular degeneration'
- Have regular physical exams by your doctor to check for diseases like diabetes or high blood pressure that can cause eye problems if not treated.
- Eating well and exercising not only helps your overall health but also your eye health. Diets rich in fruits and vegetables as well as plant-based and foods low in animal fats are the best.
- Wear sunglasses and a hat with a wide brim when outside. This will protect your eyes from too much sunlight, which can raise your risk of getting cataracts.
- Wear protective eye gear for sports, when working with chemicals, or activities such as construction or automobile projects.
- Watch your child's eyes as they grow for changes or injury. Balance screen time with time outdoors; too much screen time can lead to dry eye and strain.
- Adults should have a complete eye exam with an eye care professional every 1 to 2 years. Children should have an exam between 6 and 12 months, between 3 and 5 years, and before kindergarten then annually. The eye care professional should check your eyesight, your glasses (if applicable), and your eye muscles.
- See an eye care professional at once if you have any loss or dimness of eyesight, eye pain, fluid coming from the eye, double vision, redness, or swelling of your eye or eyelid.
