






Learn More About Prediabetes

Prediabetes is a serious health condition that can increase your risk for the development of type 2 diabetes, as well as heart disease and stroke. One in 3 adults in the U.S. are affected by prediabetes and most don't know they have it. It is possible to manage or reverse prediabetes.

Follow these tips to manage your prediabetes:

- · Start by taking small steps toward change. Overwhelming yourself can be counterproductive.
- · Increase physical activity. Get at least 30 minutes of physical activity 5 days a week.
- · Choose healthier foods and drinks most of the time. Select foods high in fiber and low in sugar and fat. Build your meals by balancing vegetables, proteins, and carbohydrates. Drink more water and limit sweetened drinks.
- · If needed, lose weight by keeping track of it and keeping it off. If overweight, losing 5 to 7 percent of your starting weight could prevent or delay diabetes.
- · Seek guidance and support from your physician and other health care professionals.






What Happened at the Cross by Billy Graham

March Book Club


We Would LOVE to have you Join Us

Rob Bell, the beloved author of Love Wins and What We Talk About When We Talk About God, goes deep into the Bible to show how it is more revelatory, revolutionary, and relevant than we ever imagined—and offers a cogent argument for why we need to look at it in a fresh, new way.

In Love Wins, Rob Bell confronted the troubling questions that many people of faith were afraid to ask about heaven, hell, fate, and faith. Using the same inspired, inquisitive approach, he now turns to our most sacred book, the Bible. What Is the Bible? provides insights and answers that make clear why the Bible is so revered and what makes it truly inspiring and essential to our lives.

Rob takes us deep into actual passages to reveal the humanity behind the Scriptures. You cannot get to the holy without going through the human, Rob tells us. When considering a



passage, we shouldn't ask "Why did God say ...?" To get to the heart of the Bible's meaning, we should be asking: "What's the story that's unfolding here and why did people find it important to tell it? What was it that moved them to record these words? What was happening in the world at that time? What does this passage/story/poem/verse/book tell us about how people understood who they were and who God was at that time?" In asking these questions, Rob goes beyond the one-dimensional question of "is it true?" to reveal the Bible's authentic transformative power.

Rob addresses the concerns of all those who see the Bible as God's Word but are troubled by the ethical dilemmas, errors, and inconsistencies in Scripture. With What Is the Bible?, he recaptures the Good Book's magic and reaffirms its power and inspiration to shape and inspire our lives today.

Lutheran World Relief School Kit Project

The Outreach Ministry group will be sponsoring the Lutheran World Relief School Kit Project.

Step One: A Thrivent card will be used to purchase materials for the bags, materials and the pattern

will be provided to anyone who wishes to sew the bags. Members of the congregation are welcome to purchase and sew bags on their own as well. The goal will be to have 150 bags ready for supplies by September.

Step Two: July and August we will collect the needed school supplies to fill the bags.

Step Three: September packing parties to pack the school bags with supplies.

Step Four: October the completed bags will be delivered to St. Johns in Bloomington to be sent to LWR for distribution to those in need around the world.



Fair Trade Prices increasing in March 2022

We received the following news from our Fair Trade providers, Equal Exchange:

"Supply chain disruptions have been in the news throughout the pandemic and you've probably personally experienced product shortages on your local grocery store shelves. The costs of doing business continue to climb for Equal Exchange and our producer partners at every step of the supply chain. At the writing of this letter, the cost of green coffee beans on the commodity market has continued to increase month after month as have transportation costs from farmers to Equal Exchange and from us to you.

We're also doing this at a time when Equal Exchange and our farmer partners are facing unprecedented challenges due to climate change. As always, our focus is to create impact for farmers, consumers, and alternative traders for the long term. This context of uncertainty makes it exceptionally difficult to plan and make the right investments for the future, particularly for vulnerable farming communities.

We thank you for your continued support and understanding. Together, our collective direct supply chains are a lifeline to farming communities at this crucial time. Increased prices will enable our important work to continue. Equal Exchange pays farmer partners well above market prices, and expects to pay farmers even more this year. We will also continue to support additional farmer co-op investments and community projects beyond product purchases."

Salem sells most of the items with a small markup and very close to cost, as our ministry is to support the small farmers and cooperatives who provide these quality products. We will share the new prices with you in our online form and at our Fair Trade booth on **March 6.** In most cases, it is coffee prices that have risen the most, but we still try to keep them reasonable as we so appreciate the support of our Salem family.

Thank you for your support and understanding! WE look forward to serving you in the coming months.
