While, the date for Easter always falls on a Sunday it is not always on a particular date on the calendar. Unlike Christmas always on December 25, Easter is calculated using a formula that coincides with the lunar calendar allowing Easter to be as early as March 22 and late as April 25. Lent then is the 40-day season preceding Easter (not counting Sundays). This means that Ash Wednesday, the first day of Lent, is March 5 this year. An article on page 3 of this issue highlights an outreach ministry project around the gospel stories of Jesus' "Feeding the 5,000."


In John's version of the story, Jesus sees a crowd coming toward him and said to Philip, "Where are we to buy bread enough for these people to eat?" Don't misunderstand, Jesus had a plan. He was asking so as to test the disciples to see if they could imagine a plan. Four chapters earlier, Jesus was informed by his mother that the wedding banquet ran out of wine. She then said, "do whatever he tells you." It is the first of Jesus' signs as he began his public ministry and as a result of turning water to wine, the disciples believed in him. Would they believe him this time? Philip replied that it would take 200 days' worth of wages to buy enough for each to have only a little. Andrew discovers a boy with a lunch of 5 loaves of bread and two fish and declares, "what are they among so many?" Clearly each of these disciples had forgotten the significance of the wedding banquet experience in Cana and how that sign instilled faith. Jesus calmly instructed the crowd of people to sit down. After giving thanks, he distributed the loaves and so also the fish and there was enough, more than enough, 12 baskets of leftovers-enough. Story after story, the bible shows that the disciples were amazed and pleased while the leaders amazed and enraged. Yet, God acted through the amazement and many were blessed.

The same is true in our day. We might ask, "what is one can of soup or a few dollars in a coffee can among the challenge to collect 5,000 items? The challenge seems too big." I have heard it said, "Don't tell God how big your challenges are. Tell your challenges how big your God is." This Lent, I encourage you to join me in pondering the miraculous feeding stories and see how Jesus works to bring wholeness to many even when we have a hard time envisioning abundant blessings coming from scarcity. Five loaves, two fish, what can they be among so many? Come and see, dear church. Come and see.

Feeding of the 5,000

We're doing it again!

Collecting 5,000 canned goods/nonperishable items during Lent!

Beginning on **Ash Wednesday**, you are invited to bring canned goods and non-perishable items. We will collect items through Easter. At the conclusion of this project, we will donate our canned goods to various food pantries, including Bethel, in our community. There will be a noisy can collection one Sunday during Lent for your participation if you would prefer to help out in that way.

Please remember if you are bringing canned goods, that if you would not eat it then our neighbors would not eat, either. Please check the expiration date also, as we cannot donate food items that are expired. This is not the time to clean out your pantry – our neighbors who will be receiving our items need our love and respect.

There is another very important component of this activity than just collecting food for local food pantries and that is the discipline of helping others. After we reach our goal of 5,000 cans, Salem still needs your canned goods. We have a collection area in the Conference Room year-round to help those who are hungry in our community. The practice of bringing of food items each week during Lent to meet our 5,000 can goal will help us to continue the discipline of bringing food items all the time. There are people who are hungry in our community year-round.

We will be collecting these 5,000 items in the area next to the Nursery. Watch for signs with directions and a barometer to track our progress!

We have done this service project a few times over the years where we collect 5,000 items for local food pantries. This service project started many years ago as a way to help us think about how many 5,000 people are and the miracle story of the Feeding of the 5,000. This miracle story is found in all four of the Gospels. It's an important story to know and reflect upon as we wonder about the ministry of Jesus and what that means for us. What can we learn about from this story of how we are to love our neighbor? This will be our Lenten focus this year.



"...the crowds followed Jesus; and he welcomed them, and spoke to them about the kingdom of God, and healed those who needed to be cured...The day was drawing to a close, and the twelve came to him and said, 'Send the crowd away, so that they may go into the surrounding villages and countryside, to lodge and get provisions; for we are in here in a deserted place.' But he said to them, 'You give them something to eat.' They said, 'We have no more than five loaves and two fish...' And taking the five loaves and the two fish, Jesus looked up to heaven, and blessed and broke them, and gave them to the disciples to set before the crowd. And all ate and were filled. What was left over was gathered up, twelve baskets of broken pieces."


